

Visiting Rules and

Number of Accompanying Persons for Outpatient Visits

Aiiku hospital has many pregnant women, newborns, and children who are considered to be susceptible to serious illnesses when exposed to infectious diseases.

When visiting patients, please practice good hand hygiene and wear a mask.

Please understand that newborn babies in particular are immunologically unprotected and are at great risk of contracting infectious diseases.

Characteristics of newborns

Immunocompetence is immature

The functions of neutrophils, lymphocytes, and monocyte macrophages, which are responsible for the body's protective immunity against infection, are inferior in newborns compared to adults.



Weak defense mechanisms in the airway and gastrointestinal mucosa

The defense mechanisms of the airway and gastrointestinal mucosa, which are entry routes for pathogenic microorganisms, are weak and the immune system is not mature.

In order to prevent hospital infection, we ask for your understanding and cooperation with the following rules for visiting and coming to the hospital.

The following persons are not allowed to visit

- Fever, respiratory symptoms, rash, nausea/vomiting symptoms, cough, diarrhea, eye symptoms (redness and eye discharge), and those who are not feeling well
- Visitors or their family members suffering from infectious diseases
- As a rule, visitors who do not comply with infection control measures as instructed by the hospital will not be allowed to visit
