

Important Notice

Continuation or change of visit restrictions

With new coronavirus infectious disease measures

Due to the infection situation in Tokyo, the following visiting restrictions will be **continued or changed** from **May 30, 2022** to prevent hospital infection.

About the attendant when visiting the OBGYN outpatient department

1 person can accompany

Ward	Visiting hours & Those who can visit
OBGYN Ward	13:00~17:00 <u>(Only one hour in the hospital)</u> Husband or partner living with only
About attendance of natural delivery	24 hours Husband or partner only (There is a condition for attending the delivery)
Pediatric Ward	Please ask the pediatric ward staff
NICU • GCU	6:00~22:00 Parents only

- ※ **Discontinue Skin-to-skin contact restrictions and return to the previous policy “Skin-to-skin contact during the first 15 minutes after birth + Breastfeeding available, Shared room in LDR until 1 hour after birth, then moved to the neonatal unit.”**
- ※ Those who will be present at childbirth at LDR cannot leave the LDR except for meals and restrooms.
- ※ Continue to be in attendance in the operating room during cesarean sections. However, if the doctor judges that the situation is urgent or the risk of the surgery is high, you will not be allowed to attend. Please follow the instructions of your doctor.
- ※ Visits to the OBGYN ward are allowed from 15 minutes before the patient enters the operating room until the time of entering the operating room. Subsequent stays in the ward must comply with the visiting rules. Post-operative explanation will be given by phone.
If the scheduled surgery time has not been decided yet, the patient should contact the partner directly as soon as the time to enter the surgery room is decided. There is a waiting space on the 3rd floor during the operation, but please leave 2 hours after entering the room.
- ※ This does not apply to visits requested by the hospital, such as in an emergency.

Requests to all visitors (patients, visitors, attendants)

Visit the hospital after measuring body temperature at home



Do not visit the hospital if you have a fever or if you feel unwell (excluding patients)

Wear a mask and disinfect hands when enter the hospital



When visit the hospital
wear your own mask

Disinfect your hands when enter the hospital
